Do I need to take the GRE and when should I take it?

Yes, the GRE is an SDSU requirement and all MSW and MSW/MPH applicants are required to take the GRE as a condition of the application. The University requires <u>all</u> sections of the GRE to be completed <u>prior to the admissions deadline</u> in order for your application to meet core graduate application requirements. *SDSU Testing Services typically proctors the GRE General Test Monday through Saturday, at 8:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Some dates and times may not be available due to the administration of the PRAXIS and TOEFL exams in the same facility. The Graduate Record Exam (GRE)

All students applying to a graduate degree at SDSU must take the Revised General GRE exam. GRE scores must be sent directly from Educational Testing Services (ETS) (http://www.ets.org/) using SDSU's Institution Code 4682. Please note the university requires that all sections (verbal, quantitative, analytical writing) of the GRE be completed.
